#### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

**Eye** Exposure is considered unlikely unless dust is generated. Hold eyelids apart and flush the eye continuously with running water for at least 15 minutes.

**Inhalation** If inhaled (dust during machining), remove from contaminated area. Apply artificial respiration if not breathing.

**Skin** If skin or hair contact occurs, remove contaminated clothing and flush skin and hair with running water.

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**Ingestion** Continue flushing with water until advised to stop by a Poisons Information Centre or a doctor.  
For advice, contact a Poison Information Centre on 13 11 26 (Australia Wide) or a doctor (at once). Due to product form and application, ingestion is considered unlikely.

Water spray or fog, for large quantities. Prevent contamination of drains and waterways.

Combustible. May evolve toxic gases (carbon oxides, hydrocarbons) when heated to decomposition. Finely divided dust may form explosive mixtures with air.

**5.3 Advice for firefighters**  
Evacuate area and contact emergency services. Toxic gases may be evolved in a fire situation. Remain upwind and notify those downwind of hazard. Wear full protective equipment including Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) when combating fire. Use waterfog to cool intact containers and nearby storage areas.
